Online Safety - social media ban



- You may have seen recent news about plans for a ban on social media for under-16s in the UK. This would include platforms such as Instagram, TikTok and Snapchat.
- These changes are not in place yet, and - if approved - are expected to come into effect from 2027.
- The aim is to improve children's safety and wellbeing online, with additional protections around contact with strangers and harmful content.
- There is nothing families need to do at this stage, but it's a good opportunity to talk with your child about safe and sensible use of technology.

We continue to reinforce online safety in school, but your support at home is essential in helping children make safe and positive choices online.
